Highlighted Projects and Programs 2018 - 2019

FAME - Females Achieving and Maintaining Excellence (FAME) provides middle and high school girls of African descent with relevant tools for life, prepares them for leadership roles and helps them cultivate a sense of cultural pride.

People-in-Crisis – The People-In-Crisis Committee assists people transitioning from homeless shelters to permanent housing by providing household items. The committee also provides clothing, food, school supplies and toiletries to needy individuals.

Health – The Section is one of the sponsors of the Annual African American Health Program Fair. Free health screenings are available as are presentations of healthy cooking and eating. A fitness component with music and dancing is also offered.

Senior Citizens – The Senior Citizens Committee provides companionship, friendship and special treats for adopted seniors in our community. Members also conduct bi-weekly Bible studies and host an Annual Senior Recognition Program.
